About the training

Use of the DTS is at no additional cost to members. Individual training is done in 40-to 60-minute increments. Each driver will have designated scenarios designed to meet the specific vehicle they drive, as well as the type of environment they drive in each day. The scenarios used will address the critical driving skills needed to be a safe driver.



In most motor vehicle accidents, factors are present relating to the driver, the vehicle, and the road, and it is the interaction of these factors that often sets up the series of events that results in an accident.



According to the National Safety Council, exceeding the posted speed limit or driving at an unsafe speed was the most common error in fatal accidents. Right-of-way violations such as failing to yield, disregarding signals and passing stop signs predominated in all accident categories.
